From the APRIM

We gladly welcome our students, families and staff back to the 2023 school year. It is with great joy that we have started the year in what feels like more normality. It is hard to believe that this time last year we had a combination of online learning and face to face teaching due to the covid restrictions being managed across South Australia. The potential of what 2023 brings is indeed an exciting prospect.

Staff Commissioning Mass

Ahead of students returning to school, our staff gathered with those from St Joseph's School, Murray Bridge and St Francis de Sales College to officially commission our school communities. Each year, these three schools share in what is known as the Commissioning Mass, taking turns to host each one. This year St Catherine's School was pleased to host at our school site with Fr Fred officiating our shared Mass. Our Siena Hall was transformed into a sacred space and staff worked together to prepare a beautiful morning tea.

The opportunity we have to come together collectively is an important part of celebrating our faith tradition and the responsibility bestowed upon those of us who work within Catholic Schools. It is through this Commissioning Mass that we renew our commitment to this vocation, and to our work within schools and parishes. The year the occasion also fell on the Feast of the Conversion of Saint Paul, and the readings of the day were used to draw out attention to our ability to trust in God's plan, and plant the seeds of faith wherever we go, as we never know just how greater impact we may have.

Through Father Fred sharing with us his own reflections about the impact that education has had on his life, we could clearly see the responsibility that we have as educators and the importance of ensuring that genuine connection to faith is not overshadowed by only teaching about faith rituals. We are off to a great start in 2CF! Here is a snapshot of some wellbeing activities that children have been involved in recently:

We spoke about what it means to be a Catholic school and we also spoke about our Dominican tradition at St Catherine's. In addition to this, we discussed how much God loves us and that all children are unique and a gift from God. We then needed to complete this sentence: "The best part of me is"

Curriculum

New Australian Curriculum -Version 9

This year the teaching staff at St Catherine's School have started to plan teaching and learning programs, including assessments, to implement the newly release Australian Curriculum Version 9.0.

The latest Australian Curriculum Review made improvements to the Foundation to Year 10 curriculum by refining, realigning and decluttering the content.â€⁻The Australian Curriculum, Version 9.0, is a more stripped-back and teachable curriculum that identifies the essential content our children should learn.

Overall, there's a reduction in content, as well as better alignment between achievement standards and content descriptions, and improved links between learning areas and both the general capabilities and cross-curriculum priorities. Some of the major changes that applies to our R-6 curriculum include;

- the removal and reduction of content so the curriculum can be taught with depth and rigour, including a 21% reduction in the number of content descriptions, which describe what is to be taught and what students are expected to learn
- a stronger focus on phonics in English
- a stronger focus on students mastering the essential mathematical facts, skills, concepts and processes, and being introduced to these at the right time

- making clear what mathematical computations need to be done without a calculator, reinforcing the importance of achieving proficiency in foundational skills
- a revision of the sequencing of content in Mathematics; in particular, telling time, introduction of fractions, recall of multiplication facts ("times tables") and solving equations
- lifting standards for Mathematics in Year 1 in relation to addition and subtraction, with additional content setting expectations about recall and proficiency with multiplication facts, beginning in Year 2
- deepening students' understanding of First Nations Australian histories and cultures, the impact on and perspectives of First Nations Australians of the arrival of British settlers as well as their contribution to the building of modern Australia
- addition of privacy and security in the Digital Technologies curriculum
- strengthening the focus on students being physically active and increased content with a focus on activity in natural and outdoor settings.
- strengthening the Foundation year by identifying the essential content to teach in the first year of school across all 8 learning areas.

This term when you receive the term overview for your child's class you will notice that the content now matches version 9 of the Australian Curriculum, with information included about not only the content being taught but also the skills that assist in transferring this knowledge into a range of processes, creating a deeper level or transfer learning.

Surface Learning

"Surface learning does not mean superficial learning. Rather, surface learning is a time when students initially are exposed to concepts, skills and strategies. Surface learning is critical because it provides a foundation on which to build as students are asked to think more deeply" (Hattie, Fisher, & Frey, 2017).

Deep Learning

"We define deep learning as a period when students consolidate their understanding and apply and extend some surface learning knowledge to support deeper conceptual understanding...We think of this as a 'sweet spot' that will often take up more instructional time, but can be accomplished only when students have the requisite knowledge to go deeper" (Hattie, Fisher, & Frey, 2017).


Transfer Learning

"Transfer learning is the point at which students take their consolidated knowledge and skills and apply what they know to new scenarios and different contexts. It is also a time when students are able to think metacognitively, reflecting on their own learning and understanding" (Hattie, Fisher, & Frey, 2017).

SeeSaw

This year we will continue to use SeeSaw as a tool for communication across our R-6 communities. SeeSaw helps continue to build connections between school and home as it shares a child's individual school portfolio with their parents. As students become familiar with the tools within this platform they are able to independently upload and share their work and achievement with their family.

You may already be familiar with SeeSaw and if you have already connected to this in previous years you will continue to be able to log in through the same method. For those who are new to our school, information will be sent home via classroom teachers to help connect you with your child's portfolio.



CyberSafe Families

With the return of the school year, our attention has again returned to the use of Information and Communication Technologies and how best to use these as a tool for learning. While the devices can be a means of adding enrichment to learning, the reality is that being a safe digital citizen requires a range of learning and building of strategies to help navigate the different dynamics of online platforms. Our commitment to students and families is to engage with external agencies such as Cybersafe Families to help educate both students and families about potential issues they may face and how they can manage these situations. Our year 5 and 6 students students again attended a student session which looked at how to conduct themselves appropriately online, cyberbullying, online gaming, how to identify unsafe situations and where to seek help. Parents were also invited to attend a parent sessions which provided a wealth of knowledge about popular online platforms, how to set up various security settings, managing online bullying and a range of other key topics.

Work within this area will continue throughout the school year with class teachers across reception to year 6 also reinforce key messages and reviewing strategies to help empower students as they spend time using digital technologies. We know the value that ICT can bring to learning both at school and at home, however staying in touch with current information remains extremely important if we are to equip our students adequately to become responsible digital citizens.

National Assessment Program - Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN)

This year students in Year 3 and Year 5 will undertake the yearly NAPLAN assessment in March with the official testing window beginning on March 15th. NAPLAN includes four different tests including writing, reading, conventions of grammar, and numeracy. Wellbeing Weeks - Setting up for Success

As you may be aware, the first two weeks of each school year are essentially devoted to wellbeing at St Catherine's. Madhavi is one of Australia's leading experts on Wellbeing and Resilience who brings over 25 years of experience and evidence based approaches to her work as an author, coach, public speaker, regular podcaster and radio guest. The focus of our day was on Educator Wellbeing.

This was a special day because it was a day focused on ourselves. As educators, it is in our nature to go above and beyond for our students and while we wouldn't have it any other way, sometimes our wellbeing can be impacted or challenged if we are not careful. Madhavi provided us with a toolbox of preventative and responsive strategies to help us all look after our wellbeing so that we can continue to be dedicated in supporting our students.

In the afternoon, we tried something different and we had such a fun Kung Fu session with Nick Bennett, who also works for Positive Minds Australia. There was so much laughter and team building going on in Siena Hall in that afternoon! Overall, we all came away from the day thinking about what a wonderful start this was to our 2023 school year at St Catherine's.

We will continue the work that Madhavi started on this day as a staff throughout the year, building on what we learned using Madhavi's book on Educator Wellbeing as a reference point.


