

Curriculum



SeeSaw

This year, we're excited to continue using SeeSaw as a key tool for communication across our R-6 communities. SeeSaw is a great way to strengthen the connection between school and home by giving parents direct access to their child's school portfolio. As students become more familiar with the platform, they can independently upload and share their work and achievements with their families.

For those of you who are already familiar with SeeSaw and have connected in previous years, you'll be able to log in using the same method. If you're new to our school, don't worry! Classroom teachers will be sending home information to guide you through the process of connecting to your child's portfolio.



Introducing the New Year 3 and Year 4 Spelling Program: SpellEx

We're thrilled to announce the launch of SpellEx, our exciting new spelling program for Year 3 and Year 4 students! The program is developed by MultiLit and is designed to follow the successful Tier 1 InitiaLit program taught in R-2 classes.

SpellEx provides explicit teaching and instruction in grapheme choices, useful rules and conventions, morphology and key spelling terminology. Incorporating assessment at regular intervals throughout the program ensures that teachers are keeping track of students'

progress, adapting instruction as needed.

By growing and consolidating their phonological, orthographic and morphological knowledge, SpellEx helps students make the right decisions when spelling words. This will benefit their writing in all curriculum areas.



NAPLAN

In March students in years 3 and 5â€⁻will undertake theâ€⁻National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN).â€⁻NAPLAN assesses the literacy and numeracy skills that students are learning through the school curriculum and allows parents/carers to see how their child is progressing against national standards.â€⁻â€⁻

NAPLAN is just one aspect of a school's assessment and reporting process. It does not replace ongoing assessments made by teachers about student performance, but it can provide teachers with additional information about students' educational progress.â€⁻

NAPLAN also provides schools, education authorities and governments with information about how education programs are working and whether young Australians are achieving important educational outcomes in literacy and numeracy.â€⁻

Cyber Safety session
