Season of Creation

This month, we joined the global Christian community in celebrating the Season of Creation—a special time for us to reflect on the beauty of God's creation and our responsibility to care for it. From September 1st to October 4th, people around the world come together to give thanks for the Earth, pray for its healing, and take action to protect the environment. Our students and staff have undertaken a range of activities which has coincided with this celebration.

Our year 5 YELP students visited Unley Primary school to undertake their third environmental workshop. Throughout the year our students have been project planning and settled on a focus on habitats, particularly nesting boxes. Inspired by the work of Unley Primary School students returned ready to spark an interest in nesting boxes and how we can reinstate replacement nesting boxes around our school environment. Work on this will continue next term and if you are able to assist with the process of helping install nesting boxes, please don't hesitate to reach out.

Another initiative which is taking place is as part of our Students as Partners program. Year 5 students have established a recycling station which is set up near our school Library. This is a place where a range of recyclable items can be dropped off in order to reduce the amount of materials ending up in landfill. Once the tubs are filled they will be dropped off the correct recycling location. If you are happy to assist with the process of dropping things off, please let me know. We have also partnered with Direct Connect to help streamline our recycling of 10c refundable items. Proceed raised through this will go to a nominated Charity. Through this process we hope that students, staff and families can further grow their knowledge around what items can be recycled and how similar recycling processes can be implemented at home.





ECO leaders took to the opportunity to plant sunflower seeds which they will nurture as they grow into giant sunflower. Students were fascinated to learn about the behaviour of these plants and how they continue to move throughout the day to follow the sun. We look forward to seeing these plants when they have grown.







A final celebration of our commitment to Ecology will be the Ecology Sunday Mass on Sunday 20th October. Families are invited to come along, as well as bring their pets for a blessing.

Year 3/4 Excursion to South Australian Maritime Museum

On Tuesday 24th September, the year 3 and 4 students went on an excursion to the South Australian Maritime Museum.

This experience linked to the students learning in HASS where they explored the First Fleet and how Australia is located to neighbouring regions and countries.

The students participated in 3 different activities being an 'Encounters' talk which highlighted how Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples traded with neighbouring countries and how Matthew Flinders created one of the first maps of Modern Australia, a self-guided tour of the Maritime Museum and a special ride on the boat 'Archie' along the Port River. The students even got to see dolphins swimming alongside the boat which was very exciting!

This was a wonderful excursion where students consolidated their learning in an engaging and interactive environment.



Year 5/6 Woodhouse Excursion

This role has been a professional goal of mine and I am excited to begin the journey of supporting our families and students in the inclusion and wellbeing space. I look forward to working in this role to support the whole child using a collaborative approach where everyone is working in partnership to ensure all children flourish.

R U OK? Day

This Term in Week 8 we celebrated R U Ok? Day at St Catherine's. This is an important day which inspires and empower everyone to meaningfully connect with the people around them and start a conversation with those in their world who may be struggling with life.

You don't need to be an expert to reach out - just a good friend and a great listener.

The children participated in activities throughout the day in their classrooms to encourage them to listen to their peers in times of need.

By starting a conversation and commenting on the changes you've noticed, you could help that family member, friend or workmate open up. If they say they are not OK, you can follow our conversation steps to show them they're supported and help them find strategies to better manage the load. If they are OK, that person will know you're someone who cares enough to ask. Use these four steps and have a conversation that could change a life:

- Ask R U OK?
- Listen
- Encourage action
- Check in

PBIS- Positive Behaviour Intervention Support

This year, St Catherine's has adopted the PBIS (Positive Behaviour Intervention Support) approach to explicitly teach students positive behaviours at school. As a school, we have had a focus on the Kiss and Drop space where teachers have been engaging students in explicit lessons around how to arrive and leave school in a safe and positive way. It may also determine if there is a need for a full speech and language assessment. If your child meets the above criteria, you will receive a permission form via the Audiri app.


